Dear Zion Family,

As we approach February—a month that we associate with love and connection—I've been reflecting deeply on the changes that continue to take place in our Zion family. I've also been thinking about what gives me life in ministry, and what calls us forward as a church.

There are so many moments in this calling as your pastor that fill me with purpose and joy. Preaching. I love to preach. Walking beside our people in seasons of joy and struggle. Ministering to children as they grow in faith. I invite you to reflect on this with me. What brings *you* life in this church? What kind of church do you dream of us becoming? What will it take—from each of us—to make that vision real?

With Lent, a season of reflection and renewal right around the corner, I am hopeful. I am grateful. And I am ready to keep walking this road with you—toward a future filled with possibility. The best is yet to come if we keep our eyes on Jesus, the head of our family!


Old Business: Will serve communion elements the previous way beginning Jan. 4.




