Dear Zion Church Family and Friends,

It's hard to believe we've turned the calendar to October! With the changing leaves comes a new season in the life of our church. Let me begin by sharing a few updates:

- Our Tuesday evening Bible Study is off to a wonderful start. Each week we gather to share insights, and grow deeper in faith and community. If you haven't joined us yet, you're always welcome to pull up a chair or log on.
- I continue to serve on the Board of Directors for the Illinois Valley Food Pantry, and I'm excited to share that the Pantry has officially moved into its new home on Progress Boulevard in Peru. I share this not only as a board member, but as your pastor because Zion UCC has been a faithful supporter of the pantry since its very beginning, and your generosity continues to make a real difference in our community.
- Sadly, our local PADS homeless shelter is busier than ever, with upwards of 50 residents most days. Zion continues to provide a meal once a month, and I'm grateful for all who help with this important work.
- Our radio show on WLPO continues to reach people throughout the Illinois Valley. I've heard from
 many folks in the community who appreciate the messages shared each week. It's a unique and
 meaningful way for Zion to minister beyond our walls.
- Looking ahead, we've got Grubby Sunday coming up an all-church fall cleanup day. It will be a fun and productive time to work side by side, caring for our building and grounds together and helping Marty with some of that extra stuff.
- Memorial Sunday will be observed on October 26, as we remember members of the Zion family and their loved ones — who have died in the past year. It is always a sacred and meaningful time of remembrance.
- We will also soon begin Confirmation with a brand new approach. I'm looking forward to walking with our young people as they explore their faith, ask questions, and take this next step on their spiritual journey.

It's a busy time of year — and Thanksgiving is just around the corner — but I want to take the bulk of this letter to reflect on something important, some reflection on my sabbatical. As you know, I recently returned from a three-month sabbatical that ended on August 31. I can honestly say it was a season of rest, renewal, and learning.

I began with a silent retreat at the Siena Retreat Center in Wisconsin. The silence gave space for things to rise to the surface — things I often bury under the noise and busyness of daily life. I found myself re-centering in God's presence in a way I didn't know I needed. I also took a "praycation" at Pilgrim Park, walking the trails, meditating, praying, and simply breathing deeply again. These were days of restoration, reminding me that I can't just pour out — I also need to be filled.

A major part of the sabbatical was also dedicated to reading, reflection, and discernment about the future of my ministry and Zion's ministry. I am a strong believer in continuing education, and this summer I completed

10 of 12 online courses toward a Ministry Certificate with Seminary Now. Courses like What Is the Church, Why Does It Still Matter?, Empowering Women in Ministry, Glorifying God in a Diverse World, and Rediscipling the White Church challenged me, inspired me, and gave me fresh insight for ministry.

Spiritually, I reconnected with God in ways I didn't even realize I needed. I had some very candid conversations with important people in my life — and those conversations were healing gifts.


I'm also incredibly grateful for the way our church leadership stepped up while I was away. People were cared for. Discipleship continued. Worship was offered. The church functioned well and thrived. I know some of you now have a new appreciation for the behind the scenes pastoral work that happens week by week.

So as I return, I'm holding two truths: 1)The church did just fine without me. 2)My calling, presence, and gifts still matter.

That's a humbling place to stand — and a freeing one. My hope going forward is that we continue to embrace a shared ministry, where pastor and people walk together, leaning on the God who never takes a sabbatical. I return with a renewed commitment: to guarding my time off and time with family, to daily quiet time for meditation and reflection, to moving this congregation into conversation about officially becoming Open & Affirming, to improving Confirmation and pastoral care, especially for our shut-ins, and to deepening our sense of covenant with the wider church.

I return rested, challenged, and grateful — and excited for what's ahead. This sabbatical was long overdue and incredibly important. But as good as it was to be away... it's even better to be back. I can't wait to see what God has in store for us! I love you all.



LOOKING FORWARD TO THE DECEMBER 12th CHRISTMAS COOKIE (AND MORE) SALE

Christmas decorations are beginning to make their appearances in stores. That's a pretty good indicator that we had better be making plans for the annual Cookie Sale. There are a few things that we'd like to let know well in advance so that you can plan accordingly.

FIRST, THE PURPOSE OF THE COOKIE SALE: The money raised from this sale helps both our congregation and the community. Some of the money helps with maintenance and improvements around the church, in the past, for example, replacing the elevator, redoing the roof on the education wing, the annual cleaning of the Fellowship Hall carpet. Funds are also used to help send kids to camp at Pilgrim Park every year. Annual donations are made to community organizations:

Illinois Valley CROP Walk, Starved Rock Regional Center for Child Development, Illinois Valley Food Pantry, United Way, Horizon House, The Red Cross, Lighted Way, Pilgrim Park, North Central Youth Services, Human Needs, Harvest Home, and PADS.

The Women's Guild organizes the sale and disperses the funds, but we rely on the whole congregation to make it happen.

SOME DATES TO REMEMBER:

The sale will be **December 12.** Please mark your calendars now. We will be asking for people to sign up to help with the sale beginning in late October.

But a lot of work will be done **December 11**, the day before the sale. The cookies and other items will be priced, wrapped, put in boxes, the tables laid out with sale items, and weighing and check out stations set up that day. We will need lots of help. Again we will be asking people to sign up to help with this beginning in late October.

Sunday, **December 7**, after church we will need help moving tables and chairs into position for the sale.

Regarding the "AND MORE" in the heading of this article. During the pandemic we had people preorder cookies and we packaged the orders for people to pick up. To accomplish this we needed to offer a limited variety of cookies, and no other baked goods. But before the pandemic we also sold breads, pies, coffee cakes and candies We're bringing those back. If you would like to make some things from the "and more" category we'd love to have them.

Regarding DECORATED CUT-OUTS, aka sugar cookies. We don't plan on having a cookies decorating party, but Dixie Tonozzi has a great recipe for an easy glaze. We'll make that available in the Nov. Newsletter.

We'll keep you up to date and plans progress. Thanks for your interest and your support.



Weight Watchers meets every Saturday morning at 8:00. We're happy to provide space for this worthwhile service to our community.


